## Artificial intelligence - thus it changes our world of labour

Artificial intelligence is on the rise, the development steps of this technology are rapid. But how will AI change our world of labour in the future? Will intelligent assistance systems, bots and robots take away our jobs? And what new jobs will be created?

We dare to look ahead.

Artificial intelligence is the term used when software and machines succeed in reproducing human calculations and actions as realistically as possible. We are all familiar with this type of artificial intelligence in our personal everyday lives, for example in the form of voice assistants such as Siri or Alexa. More and more companies in the digital economy see artificial intelligence as a "hot topic" today.

Decision-makers see great opportunities to reduce costs and personnel expenses across all sectors. Many experts therefore warn that employment effects will be rather negative. On the other hand, there is the hope of reducing monotonous and dangerous work for humans. In addition, new areas of work are also emerging, not only in the development of AI systems.

So what does the future of work look like in the age of AI?

The Budapest Office of the Friedrich Ebert Stiftung, along with the industrial union VASAS, is organising a series of panel discussions on the topic of artificial intelligence in order to explore the human side of technological development and the consequences for the future of labour, opinionforming and democracy. The last event in the series in November will deal with current debates and approaches to the (European) regulation of the use of AI.
