Major foreign policy initiatives have been characteristic features of the subsequent Orbán governments since 2010. Overhauling foreign policy and constant reorientations, vehement interpretation of international developments towards internal audiences and turbulent staffing decisions related to the foreign policy apparatus are central components in this approach. The constant advertising of success permeates government narratives, but when we dig deeper, it is much harder to evaluate these developments as major accomplishments.

During our discussion, we will try to reflect on the main orientations of Orbán's foreign policy and to identify its tangible failures and successes. We will discuss how Hungary's "image might have has changed, and how the discourse around foreign policy has evolved in the Hungarian public sphere.
